

(Semen Cuscutae), (Fructus Ligustri Lucidi) and (Herba Ecliptae) nourish Kidney yin, and help thechief herbs to nourish the blood and yin, and regulate the Chong and Renvessels. They work as the deputies. (Radix et Rhizoma Salviae Miltiorrhizae), (Radix Angelicae Sinensis) and (Herba Leonuri) assist to nourish and move the blood, in order to tonify without stagnating.
