作者简介

托马斯·哈代（1840-1928），英国诗人、小说家。他是横跨两个世纪的作家，早期和中期的创作以小说为主，继承和发扬了维多利亚时代的文学传统；晚年以其出色的诗歌开拓了英国20世纪的文学。

哈代的小说以他所生长生活的英格兰西南部地区为背景，富有浓重的地方色彩。他的小说大体分为3类：性格与环境的小说、罗曼史与幻想的小说和精于结构的小说。哈代小说风格多变，题材广泛，内容丰富。他因在小说创作上所取得的突出成就而成为英国19世纪后期的代表作家。

哈代作为诗人，也颇有声誉。哈代的诗冷峻、深刻、细腻、优美，言简意赅，自成一格，较他的小说更具有现代意识。诗剧《列王》是哈代思想艺术集大成之佳作。

哈代晚年因在诗歌小说创作上的突出成就而获得巨大荣誉。逝世后，葬于伦敦威斯敏斯特诗人角，其心脏则按本人遗愿葬于故乡的斯廷斯福德教堂墓地。他写的传记和一些文学论文、文学笔记以及书信陆续出版。他在英国和世界各国具有相当大的影响。中国从上世纪20~30年代开始陆续介绍、翻译哈代的诗及小说作品，他已成为中国读者熟悉的英国作家之一。
