插图：Usually it takes millions of years for a sea to turn into land, but this could be realized in a few months at the Yellow River Delta. Only here can the rapid transformation of land and sea be witnessed. The Yellow River Delta is located at the river's estuary in north Shandong Province. Like a huge yellow dragon, the Yellow River carries a large quantity of sand and silt and roars through until it gushes into Bohai Bay, dyeing a large area yellow. Each year the river carries more than one billion tons of sand and silt from the inland to its estuary, which gathers sediment to form the "newest land" on the earth and constantly pushes the coastline forward, at an annual average speed of 2 to 3 km. As a result, China sees an increase of its land by scores of sq. km every year. The Yellow River Delta is a huge sector of land centered at the course of the Yellow River, with those areas farthest from the sea in existence from the earliest times. Therefore, walking from the inland to the seaside along the river can yield answers to the mystery of the transformation of land and sea.
