插图：Chinese Dress There are several common styles of Chinese dress that have made a comeback in recent years . Many of these have been modernized, while still retaining some of the traditional flavour . Today we heard about旗袍, often just called qipao in English , or sometimes known by the Cantonese word cheongsam . In Mandarin we would say长衫, long gown . This style of dress actually comes from the Manchu nationality. The rulers of the last dynasty, the Qing , were Manchus , SO nobility often wore Manchu style clothing . The qipao is a one-piece dress with a high neck . It is usually fairly tight fitting , with a slit up one or both sides . Of course , there are many variations , but this is a very elegant , feminine gown . Another style we heard about today was the唐装 . It's a little like a中山装, a Chinese tunic suit often referred to in English as a Mao suit . 中山装 refers to Sun Yat-sen , in Chinese孙中山, who founded the Republic of China in 1911 . In the West , this suit is perhaps called the Mao suit because it became the most popular form of dress after the founding of the People's Republic of China in 1949 . But the唐装 is slightly different . 唐装 are usually made with silk and have traditional Chinese patterns . They are much more fancy and stylish than the plain中山装 . Again , there are many variations on this style .

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
